#144 PUBLIC HEARING

At 7:00 PM Mayor Stumpf opened the Public Hearing on the Tentative Budget.

The following resolution was moved by Trustee Sherwood, seconded by Trustee Dominessy:

#145 ADOPT THE 2018-2019 BUDGET

WHEREAS: the Tentative Budget for the year 2018-2019 has been presented to the Board and an advertised Public Hearing was held.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the said tentative budget be and hereby is adopted as the budget of the Village of Delevan for the year 2018-2019 with a tax rate of 15.495062 mils per thousand.

#146 DELINQUENT WATER

Water bills to be placed on taxes – Clerk Spencer had previously sent out notices to water bill customers that owed more than one quarter billing, which had to be paid by April 9, 2018 or the delinquent amount would be placed on their 2018 June taxes. Spencer provided a list of those remaining unpaid for the board to review.

It was moved by Trustee Hunt, seconded by Trustee Reisdorf to authorize Clerk Spencer to add the delinquent water bills to the taxes, \$6231.01 total.

TREE COMPLAINT

Clerk Spencer apprised the Board that Mr. and Mrs. Tucker who reside at 46 Delevan Avenue had been to the Village Office to discuss the maple tree in their front yard that is dying. Mr. and Mrs. Tucker believe that 20 years ago the former Supt. of Public Works had told them the maple tree was in the Village's right of way and therefore a village tree and that they could not take it down. Supt. Smith measured the tree last year and determined it was not in the right of way and therefore not the Village's responsibility. The Board requested the Clerk send the Tucker's a letter that the determination was that the tree was not the Village's tree.
